
Haltwhistle & District Angling Association Map of fishing at Woodhall

The beat is 1.35 miles long of single bank on the north side of the river

Woodhall Farm is about three miles to the east of Haltwhistle [Postcode NE47 7EY]. On arrival there is one gate to drive through, although it is often open. Park on the grass to the right of the lane above the "no parking beyond this point", sign. We are not allowed to take vehicles to the river.

Walk down the track past the farmyard on your left, through the gate and on under the railway, then follow the track to the river. Upstream from this point is the Rocky Pool. The fence is not the boundary; you can climb over the fence and start fishing at the neck of the pool. You will see our signs. The first pool downstream is the Whin Pool. It is another good pool but we are on the wrong side of this pool, although it is fishable in parts. Please consider any anglers on the far bank. Next we have Woodhall Corner where the river is turned as it runs into a cliff face. There is then some broken water running down into the Overhang Pool. There is then more broken water, although it does produce fish, running into Woodhall Flat. The next stretch is rather poorer water but fish can be taken in higher water. The lower end of the beat has a good streamy pool and one other small pool below. The sign to show the end of this stretch is a long way from the riverbank but it is clearly seen from the river.

Approaching the river from the lower end of the beat at Tow House is not so easy and does entail a walk to the start of our fishing of some 650 yards. The parking is limited **[Post code NE47 7EQ]**. If you follow the signs to Tow House you will find yourself on a lane running through cottages, follow it through as it swings to the right and park on the grass on the railway side. There is room for only two cars. I would recommend parking at Woodhall Farm and fishing your way down.
